Pre- Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) are delivered to students with disabilities to help students plan for appropriate vocational and training goals, acquire work-place readiness skills, gain vocational maturity, and prepare for successful community life.



Lessons can be provided in these 5 areas:

- Job Exploration Counseling
- Instruction in Self-Advocacy
- Counseling on opportunities for enrollment in post-secondary educational and training programs at institutions of higher education
- Workplace readiness training to develop social skills and independent living
- Work-based learning experiences

BEP

The BEP (Business Enterprise Program) is housed at Cave Spring Center. Under the Randolph-Sheppard Act of 1936, GVRA's BEP creates opportunities for qualified GVRA consumers, who are legally blind, to become independent business owners in the food service industry. The federal and state statutes governing this program provide a "priority" for blind vendors to operate food service facilities in federal and government buildings.

What does BEP offer?

★ Training

This program provides classroom and operational skills training with an emphasis in food service management, quality customer service, menu planning, health and safety, and merchandising.

★ Opportunities

This program offers participants the opportunity to achieve a dependable income, and benefits such as health insurance, life insurance, and a sound retirement.

The Cave Spring Center is in historic Cave Spring, Georgia and features a modern academic/administrative building, a fifty-bed residential dormitory and two greenhouses. Cave Spring Center is an ideal option for individuals with disabilities in transition from high school who would benefit from vocational rehabilitation training and services provided on a small campus.

Employment Development Services

The Cave Spring Center provides training and preparation of individuals with disabilities for integrated competitive employment. Students are provided an individualized program of study to increase skills and independence in activities of daily living and development of interpersonal skills and self-determination. Each student is provided an opportunity to participate in classroom studies with generalization to dorm and campus life, as well as the community.

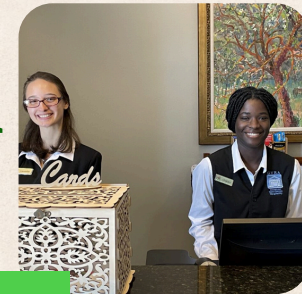
