

### **Vocational Rehabilitation Services**



Roosevelt Warm Springs and Cave Spring Center are GVRA residential centers that offer specialized services for youth who are Deaf or hearing impaired. Each location employs American Sign Language (ASL) interpreters, certified Deaf educators and other support staff.



### **School Partnerships**

GVRA partners with Georgia's leading schools serving youth with hearing and vision related disabilities. Specially-trained Certified Rehabilitation Counselors (CRCs) offer Pre Employment Transition Services to qualifying students 14 and older at the Atlanta Area School for the Deaf, the Georgia School for the Deaf, and the Georgia Academy for the Blind.
