GVRS Board Chair Tom Wilson welcomed everyone in attendance and called the meeting to order at 1:01 p.m.

Client Services Update

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Disability Adjudication Services (DAS)

 Ms. Rita McWhorter, DAS Program Director, shared current information on the DAS program, provided statistics, and provided data from federal fiscal years 2018 – 2024.

Public Comment & Adjournment

Chairman Wilson opened the floor for public comment. Stephanie Cutrufelli, Assistant Director of the Georgia Client Assistance Program, read the following statement:

The Georgia Client Assistance Program, in conjunction with The Georgia Advocacy Office, would like to submit the below public comment for the upcoming May 14, 2025 GVRS Board Meeting.

In the FFY 2023 GVRA Monitoring Report, RSA emphasized the importance of documenting Roosevelt Warm Springs' protocols in the agency's policies, procedures, and SOPs. GVRA Leadership advised RSA they expected to complete the necessary revisions by August 2023. Drafted policies for Roosevelt Warm Springs have not been submitted to the State Rehabilitation Council and/or the Georgia Client Assistance Program for stakeholder feedback.

GVRA is also proposing limiting RWS admissions to those aged 18-24 beginning Fall 2025. The proposed admission change is significant and requires public input and hearings be conducted by the State Rehabilitation Council (34 CFR § 361.20 Public participation requirements) per the RSA technical assistance received by The Georgia Client Assistance Program on April 3, 2025. CAP shared RSA's guidance with Executive Director Wells on April 7, 2025 and presented its findings to the State Rehabilitation Council on April 23, 2025.

 Is the GVRS Board aware GVRA has had 1.5 years to draft and submit policies pertaining to Georgia's State Operated Comprehensive Rehabilitation Center, e.g. Roosevelt Warm Springs?



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- Was the GVRS Board knowledgeable of the proposed Fall '25 admissions changes to RWS?
- Has the GVRS Board been made aware that the Georgia Client Assistance Program and the State Rehabilitation Council have been voicing concerns to Executive Director Chris Wells on these issues since January 2025?
- How does the GVRS Board plan to ensure that GVRA is in compliance with RSA's requirements/guidance on this issue?

Chairman Wilson thanked Ms. Cutrufelli for her comments and stated that a written response would be forthcoming.

Adjournment

With no further business to discuss, Chairman Wilson called for a motion to adjourn.

On the motion of Secretary Adams, seconded by Mr. Camuso, the board unanimously voted to adjourn the meeting at 2:31 p.m.





Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency Position Count and Turnover Rates






- **Bud McCall Grant** Effective January 2024, GVRA began offering the Bud McCall grant to students with disabilities seeking post-secondary opportunities and other VR services.
- Individuals with permanent disabilities that result in substantial impediment to employment may be eligible for the grant following application and acceptance as a GVRA client for VR services.
- Undergraduate students who meet the requirements are eligible for the grant for up to five years.
- The annual grant totals up to \$17,725 annually to cover tuition, books, and maintenance costs.










