

- Creating a new District to allow RWS and CS staff to more comprehensively serve VR clients from the beginning to the end of the VR Process.
- Wait list for PC 2 will be "cleared" by the end of December and all clients assigned to PC 2 will be receiving VR services.
- 635 clients have been removed from the Wait List to date and have had services initiated.
- 532 clients have been closed successfully since July 1, 2021
- 40 counselors being recruited







Program Services Highlights

Disability Adjudication Services

- Closed 88,712 total cases

- Hired 76 new employees (74 were Adjudicators)
- The DAS Training Team received SSA's **Thomas M. Leahy Creative Achievement Award** for its innovative ways of training new hires during the ongoing COVID pandemic.

Business Enterprise Program

- 18 Blind Vendors have received payments for a total of \$190,920 out of \$702,000
- BEP has entered into a lease agreement with GIB for equipment storage
- The SLA (State Licensing Agency) continues to work with the Committee of Blind Vendors on a payroll transition plan



Georgia Industries for the Blind



- GIB revenue from the sale of products has declined by 27% between • FY 2018 and FY 2021 primarily due to supply chain issues and the COVID-19 pandemic between FY 2020 and FY 2021.
- Materials such as pressboard and Tyvek have been increasingly • difficult to locate and keep in inventory – products requiring these materials accounted for 64% of total GIB sales in FY 2020.
- COVID-19 accounted for over \$1M in sales revenue losses between ٠ March 2020 (FY 2020) and December 2020 (FY 2021).



Georgia Industries for the Blind Highlights

• Furloughs

- Due to supply chain issues GIB employees were furloughed for 4 weeks
- $\,\circ\,$ Raw materials have started to come in
- $\,\circ\,$ Furloughs have ended and employees are back at full schedule

Griffin

o Griffin warehouse is now being used by BEP for storage

• Shredding Services

- o GIB has begin providing shredding services to VR
- \circ 12,000 lbs. of documents were received from College Park
- $\circ\,$ Coordinating with other VR offices in the coming weeks
- $\,\circ\,$ BEP will also use GIB for it's shredding needs
- Different shredding models (onsite Vs pick-up) are being explored

- Visit to Alabama Industries for the Blind (AIDB Talladega)
 - $\,\circ\,$ AIDB is also a state run NIB agency
 - Raj Pagadala & Teresa Eggleston were invited for a tour (10/26/21)
 - $\,\circ\,$ New business ideas are being considered based on AIDB visit

Mask Machine Donation

- Non-profit in NC has offered to donate two mask producing machines
- Chris Wells and Raj Pagadala to visit facility in Fletcher, NC on 11/12/21
- Masks NIB RFI
 - NIB has reached out to its agencies with a Request for Information
 - Seeking information on mask producing capabilities
 - GIB is well positioned to be preferred supplier




Call Center
